Olin and Uris Libraries (Free) **161 Ho Plaza**

At over 8 million printed volumes and over a million ebooks, the Cornell University Library is the sixteenth largest library in North America. Olin and Uris Libraries are just two of our fourteen on-campus libraries. Olin Library is the University's largest information resource, home to our humanities and social science collections. Uris Library is the first dedicated library building, opening in 1891. It houses the "Harry Potter" Library, numerous study spaces, and the 24-hour "Cocktail Lounge".

Outdoors

Taughannock Falls Gorge Trail ★ 1740 Taughannock Boulevard

Taughannock Falls plunges 215 feet past rocky cliffs that tower nearly 400 feet above the gorge. Gorge and rim trails offer spectacular views from above the falls and from below at the end of the gorge trail. Park map can be found here.

Driving Directions from Cornell: Follow Ithaca Road and Seneca Street into Ithaca Commons. Turn right at Taughannock Blvd (NY-89) then travel 9 miles north.





Stewart Park (Free) 1 James L Gibbs Drive

Located at the South end of Cayuga Lake, <u>Stewart Park</u> features pavilions, tennis courts, a playground with several play structures including a carousel, athletic fields, a duck pond, a spray pool, and a bird sanctuary. The Newman Municipal Golf Course is located adjacent to the park.

Stewart Park is accessible by TCAT route 13.

Driving Directions from Cornell: Follow Tower Road and West Avenue to West Campus, turn left on to University Ave and continue to Lake Street for 2 miles. Turn left immediately after the overpass into the park.

Buttermilk Falls ★ 112 East Buttermilk Falls Road

The upper park has a small lake, hiking trails through woodlands and along the gorge and rim, picnic areas and playing fields. The lower park has a campground, natural pool and playing fields, beyond which is Larch Meadows. Park map can be found here.

Driving Directions from Cornell: Travel southwest on Route 13, one-mile past Walmart.



Six Mile Creek Winery & Distillery 1151 Slaterville Road

Six Mile Creek Vineyard is Ithaca, NY's oldest winery and distillery. Located in a lovely 19th Century restored Dutch Colonial barn, the bar offers a welcoming environment to sample wines and spirits from the Finger Lakes. Cornell Lab of Ornithology (Free) 159 Sapsucker Woods Road

Enjoy the Lab of O's art and science exhibits; watch birds rain or shine; and explore 4 miles of trails through their 230-acre sanctuary. More information and a map of trails can be found on their <u>website</u>.

Driving Directions from Cornell: Travel north on Warren Road towards Hanshaw Road. Turn right onto Hanshaw, then turn left onto Sapsucker Woods Road. The Lab of O is located one mile north on the left.

Museum of the Earth 1259 Trumansburg Road

The museum's 8,000-square-foot permanent exhibition takes visitors on a journey through 4.5 billion years of history, from the Earth's origin to the present day. Through hands-on, visual exhibitions and outreach, the Museum of the Earth encourages critical thinking about life on Earth in the past and today, and how our species is affecting the natural world. Driving Directions from Cornell: Drive west on Campus Road and East Buffalo Street to NY-96N (Cliff Street). Continue onto NY-96N for 2 miles and the museum is on the right.
